[The I-Poem Project](#): a novel approach to centering the voices of research subjects. Poems draw on over 12 years of qualitative research representing thousands of pages of transcripts; created with undergraduate research mentees. This form of poetic inquiry allows researchers to decenter ourselves from inquiries and captures how participants speak about themselves. I-Poems are an accessible and beautiful way to convey a participant's voice.

Each line of an I-Poem begins with an I-statement pulled from transcripts of interviews or focus groups, seeking to convey the essence of a long conversation or interview.
