SUMMER EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL EXPERIENCE PROGRAM (SECEP)

The Summer Educational and Cultural Experience Program (SECEP) is designed and hosted by Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice and Department of Political Science and International Relations for Chinese students interested in gaining in-depth and comprehensive understanding of American society and culture. By attending college classes and seminars, visiting governmental institutions and communicating with local professors and students, students can obtain first hand experience of American college life as well as the cultural, social and political environment of the society. The theme of the 2019 program is "Politics and Justice in the United States."



SEMINAR: AMERICAN POLITICS

Professor Kassra Oskooii

This course will provide an overview of the key players and institutions of American politics. In particular, we will place specific emphasis on the following questions: How democratic is the Constitution? Has the U.S. become more or less democratic over time? What is executive power and how does it function in a system of checks and balances? Why have U.S. presidents become more powerful over time? How does Congress function, and why is it so difficult to pass legislation?



SEMINAR: INTRODUCTION TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Professor Cresean Hughes

This course provides a comprehensive introduction to the major tenets of the American criminal justice system as well as the contemporary issues and challenges of addressing crime and deviance in the modern society.



SPECIAL TOPIC: LEGAL EDUCATION IN THE U.S.

State Senator Bryan Townsend

This lecture will provide an overview of the history, development and future of legal education in contemporary American society. Problems in the current education system as well as related issues will also be discussed.



SPECIAL TOPIC: PROSTITUTION AND SOCIAL CHANGE

Professor Chrysanthi Leon

The sale of sex has long been criminalized or stigmatized in much of the world, but we have seen a recent increase in diversion programs that target sex workers. Often grounded in paradigms of criminalization, diversion programs purportedly address "root causes" of offending. The "problems" assumed to be at the root of the street-based sex work sector - the prime target for local enforcement and international policy - do not usually align with what sex workers and their advocates perceive. This lecture will provide an overview of the policing of street-based sex work from a variety of perspectives, including how criminal justice actors understand the decision to sell sex.



JOHN A. PELESKO

Dean, College of Arts and Sciences

John A. Pelesko is a distinguished mathematician as well as a dedicated professor of mathematical sciences. His record of service includes work at UD with the Data Science Initiative, the Honors Program Task Force and the General Education Task Force, and work within the State of Delaware and the Delaware Department of Education to implement a new high-school course, "Foundations of College Mathematics." He also co-chairs a statewide effort to reduce the need for remedial mathematics among Delaware's high school graduates.

DAVID C. WILSON

Associate Dean, College of Arts and Sciences

David C. Wilson is a professor of political science and international relations. He teaches courses in political psychology; statistics, data analysis, research methodology; and public opinion and polling analysis. Professor Wilson's research examines the effects of social information on public opinion and political behavior using survey experiments. He specializes in survey measurement, political communication, and public opinion on racial attitudes, and is currently examining opinions on voter ID laws.





KAREN F. PARKER

Chair, Department of Sociology and
Criminal Justice

Karen F. Parker is a Professor of Sociology and Criminology. Her research interests include exploring the influence of macro-level constructs on urban violence, particularly labor markets, racial segregation, immigration and concentrated disadvantage. Much of professor Parker's recent work has incorporated longitudinal models to examine how changes in the local urban economy differentially influence race-specific homicide rates over time and detailed examinations of the American crime drop.

DAVID P. REDLAWSK

Chair, Department of Political Science and
International Relations

David P. Redlawsk is the James R. Soles Professor and Professor of Political Science and International Relations. Dr. Redlawsk is President of the International Society of Political Psychology for 2018-2019. His research focuses on campaigns, elections, the role of information in voter decision making, and on emotional responses to campaign information. Dr. Redlawsk has received several grants from the National Science Foundation, and served on the Board of Overseers for the American National Election Studies from 2009-2013.





CRESEAN HUGHES

Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice

Cresean Hughes is an Assistant Professor of Sociology and Criminal Justice. His research interests include race, ethnicity, punishment, and social control, with a particular focus on school discipline and other youth justice outcomes. His research has been published in the *Journal of Research in Crime and Delinquency*. He is also a member of UD's Race, Justice, and Policy Research Initiative.

KASSRA A.R. OSKOOII

Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science and International Relations

Kassra A.R. Oskooii is a Professor of Political Science and International Relations. His primary areas of specialization are American politics and political methodology. His research and teaching focus on race and ethnicity politics, political psychology, political behavior, and survey research methods and experiments. His research has appeared in peer-reviewed academic journals such as the *British Journal of Political Science*, *Political Behavior*, *Political Psychology*, and *Politics and Religion*. Dr. Oskooii also has extensive experience designing, programming, implementing, and analyzing experiments and public opinion surveys.





CHRYSANTHI S. LEON

Associate Professor, Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice



Chrysanthi S. Leon is an Associate Professor of Sociology and Criminal Justice, Women & Gender Studies, and Legal Studies. Leon is an interdisciplinary scholar in the area of penology, law and society whose research and teaching includes sex crime and punishment, sex work, and law and literature *Inside Out*. Her book, *Sex Fiends, Perverts and Pedophiles: Understanding Sex Crime Policy in America* is available from NYU Press. Leon is co-editor, with Katie Hail-Jares and Corey Shdaimah, of *Challenging Perspectives on Street-Based Sex Work* (Temple University Press).

BRYAN TOWNSEND

State Senator, Delaware



Bryan Townsend is a state senator and attorney committed to supporting hardworking Delaware families. After receiving his J.D. degree from Yale Law School, Senator Townsend clerked for the Delaware Court of Chancery and then became an attorney at a major Delaware law firm. Townsend has been a state senator since 2012. He chairs the Health, Children, & Social Services Committee and serves on several other committees, including Education; Capital Improvement; and Banking, Business, & Insurance. He has a track record of bringing together diverse stakeholders to solve difficult issues, and he has been designated as one of the most productive legislators in Delaware's General Assembly.

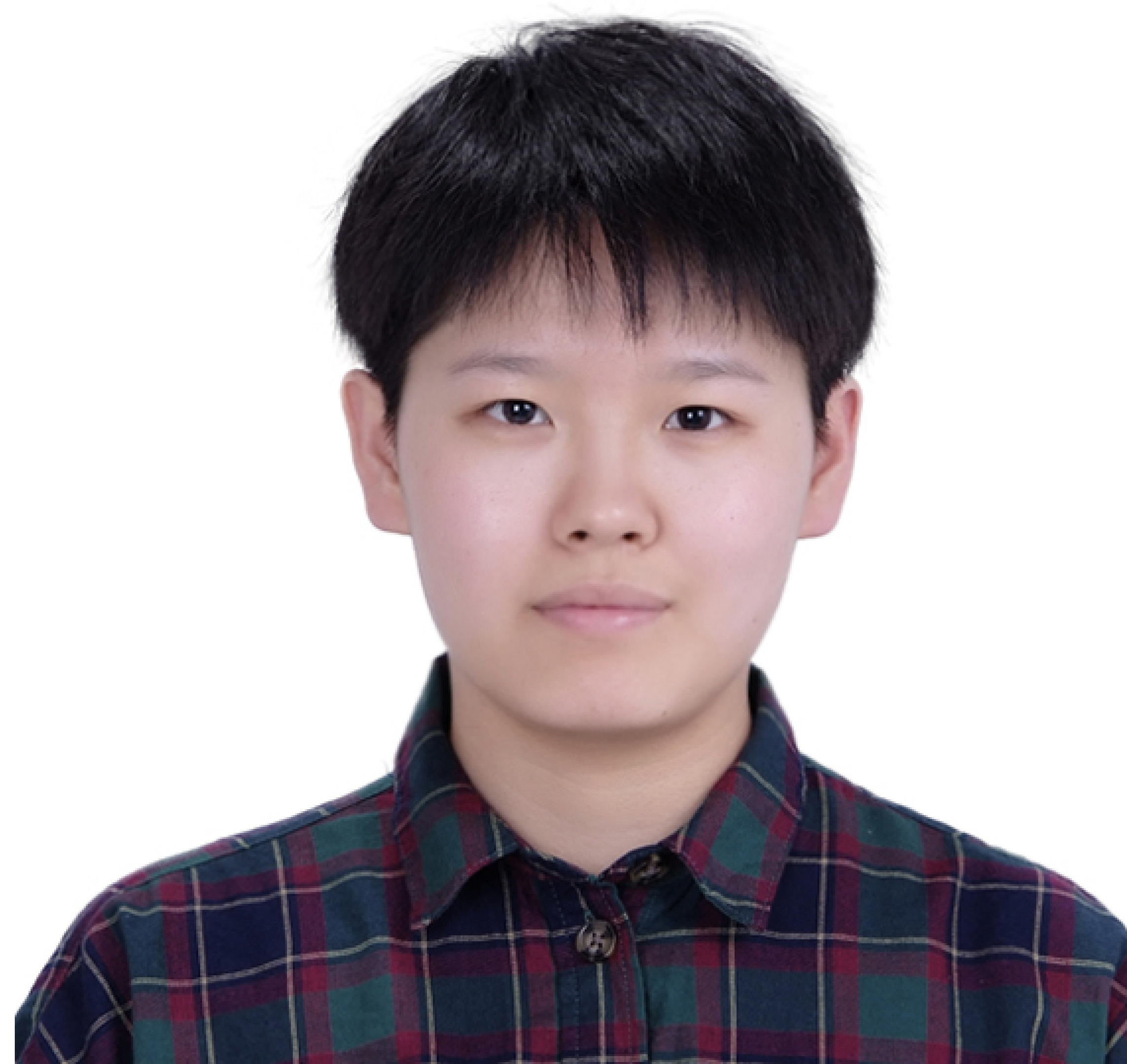


HUANYU CAI
